

Incessant rains disrupt life in Kerala; IMD sounds red alert for Kottayam, Ernakulam

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM, MAY 28 /- After a brief lull, incessant rains accompanied by gusty winds pounded several parts of Kerala on Tuesday, disrupting normal life.

South and central districts like Thiruvananthapuram, Kollam, Kottayam, and Ernakulam mainly bore the brunt of the continuous downpour, which caused waterlogging, damage to houses, trees to be uprooted and tiny water bodies to overflow cutting across towns and villages. With the rain getting intense, the Indian Meteorological Department (IMD) placed Kottayam and Ernakulam districts under red alert today. An orange alert was sounded in Pathanamthitta, Alappuzha, and Idukki, while Thiruvananthapuram, Kollam, Thirissur, Palakkad, Malappuram, and Kozhikode were placed under a yellow alert, as per the latest IMD update. Experts said cloudburst could be the reason for the heavier rainfall that pounded various parts of the port city of Kochi, especially

the Kalamassery region, where flood water entered hundreds of houses. Many narrow lanes and busy roads in Kochi and adjacent areas were submerged due to continuous downpours since early morning.

People could not venture out of their homes in many areas of the port city as roads were flooded. Vehicles were seen moving at snail's pace on highways following the rain. Normal life was hit in the Kakkanad-Infopark and Aluva-Edappally areas due to waterlogging. An uprooted tree fell on a state-run KSRTC bus at Thoppumpady in Kochi. Luckily, passengers escaped unhurt. Four shutters of Malankara Dam in Idukki district were raised following heavy rains, district authorities said. Intense rains caused mudslides and disrupted traffic on Erattupetta and Vagamon road in Kottayam district. The city and rural areas of the capital district of Thiruvananthapuram have witnessed heavy rains since Monday

night. In nearby Neyyattinkara, a house was severely damaged after an uprooted tree fell on it during heavy rains accompanied by winds. Nedumangadu, Neyyattinkara, Kattakkada, and Amboori areas, located in the high ranges of the district, received widespread rainfall.

According to locals, a portion of a hill behind the famous Bali mandapam at Papanasam in nearby Varkala caved in because of heavy rains. The eco-tourism centre in hill station Ponnudi was closed following bad weather. With heavy rains continuing to lash rural areas of Thiruvananthapuram, the shutters of the Aruvikkara dam here have been raised up to 90 cm, district authorities said. As the shutters would be raised up to 150 cm in the wake of the intense downpour, people living nearby are advised to remain vigilant. High tides and rough seas were witnessed in coastal areas, posing a threat to fishing vessels.

Two incidents of boat capsizing were also reported off the coasts of Muthalappozhi fishing hamlet, lo-

cated about 30 kilometres away from here. In one incident, a fisherman died after his boat overturned due to high tidal waves this morning. Three others, who also fell into the sea, were rescued and rushed to a nearby hospital, police said. State Revenue Minister K Rajan said central Kerala region witnessed heavier rainfall, and the Palluruthi region in Ernakulam district alone received 95 mm rainfall in one and a half hours, which was rare in recent times. Kalamassery received 57 mm rainfall in one and a half hours, he pointed out. Steps have been taken to open 3,597 relief camps in the southern state, in view of the situation arising out of rains, he said. Preparations are underway to set up camps that can accommodate over five lakh people during emergencies. A red alert indicates heavy to extremely heavy rain of over 20 cm in 24 hours, while an orange alert means very heavy rain of 11 cm to 20 cm, and a yellow alert means heavy rainfall between 6 cm and 11 cm. Man kidnapped from MP, forced to drink urine after dispute; FIR lodged against 7 persons

GUNA, MAY 28 /- A group of persons allegedly kidnapped a relative from Madhya Pradesh's Guna district following a dispute and took him to Rajasthan where they forced him to drink urine and paraded him in a woman's clothes, police said on Tuesday.

The accused also allegedly tansured the man's head and made him wear a garland of shoes, they said. The incident took place in neighbouring Rajasthan on May 22, but as the man was kidnapped from Guna, an FIR was registered at the Fatehgarh police station here against seven persons

late Monday night. Superintendent of Police (SP) Sanjeev Sinha said. The accused persons had also shot a video of the torture, shared it on social media and demanded Rs 25 lakh from the man, as per a complaint lodged by him.

Fatehgarh police station in-charge Kripal Singh said 10-12 persons allegedly kidnapped the man and took him in a jeep to Jhalawar and Patan in Rajasthan where they beat him up, made him wear a garland of shoes and woman's clothes and forced him to drink urine.

They also shot videos of the inhuman treatment and demanded Rs 25 lakh from him. When police came to know about it, the accused set the man free on the condition that he would pay them Rs 20 lakh within

three days, he said. SP Sinha said, "We have taken cognisance of the incident. The complainant came to me following which I sent him to Fatehgarh police station. He was beaten up in Rajasthan but as the crime of kidnapping him took place here, a case was registered in Guna district in the matter." The FIR was registered against seven persons under various Indian Penal Code sections, including 506 (criminal intimidation), 365 (kidnapping) and 34 (acts done by several persons in furtherance of a common intention), Singh said. Reacting to the incident, the Opposition Congress in a post on X claimed Chief Minister Mohan Yadav was unable to handle the state and his (home) department and demanded his resignation. (PTI)

Man tries to kill person by ramming car into 2-wheeler in Pune; arrested

PUNE, MAY 28 /- Police have arrested a man after he allegedly tried to kill a person riding a scooter by ramming his car into the two-wheeler in the wee hours of Tuesday in Maharashtra's Pune district, officials said. The incident took place at around 1 am in Pimpri area after the accused found the victim was talking to the

former's girlfriend, they said. The accused, identified as Sushil Kale, got to know the victim was talking to his girlfriend in a locality in Pimpri, a police official said. "The accused then went there and allegedly rammed his car into the victim's scooter," the official from Pimpri Chinchwad police said. "As the victim fell off the two-

wheeler, the accused got down from his car and allegedly beat him up. The victim, who received injuries, was admitted to a hospital and was reported to be out of danger," he said.

The accused was arrested and booked under Indian Penal Code section 307 (attempt to murder), the police said. (PTI)

Delhi cops file supplementary chargesheet in Shraddha Walkar murder case

NEW DELHI, MAY 28 /- The Delhi police have filed a supplementary chargesheet containing more digital and forensic evidence reports to nail Aaftab Amin Poonawala, who stands accused of killing his live-in partner Shraddha Walkar and dismembering her body, court sources said on Tuesday. The nearly 3,000-page chargesheet was filed before metropolitan magistrate Aviral Shukla, they said. Poonawala is alleged to have strangled Walkar and chopped her body into pieces in the national capital's Mehrauli in May 2022 before scattering the body parts in different areas of the city to escape detection. He has been charged under sections 302 (murder) and 201 (causing disappearance of evidence of offence) of the Indian Penal Code.

Sources said the chargesheet mainly consisted of Google locations, search history and other digital and forensic evidence reports. The city police have claimed these evidences further corroborated the charges against Poonawala, the sources said. A 6,629-page chargesheet was filed against Poonawala in January last year. (PTI)

1 dead after boat capsizes mid-sea in Palghar

PALGHAR, MAY 28 /- A 30-year-old man drowned after a fishing boat carrying construction materials capsized mid-sea in Maharashtra's Palghar district, an official said on Tuesday. While the incident occurred on Sunday evening, the body of the man was fished out this morning, the official said. A boat carrying 12 persons with construction materials from Arnala jetty capsized mid-sea around 7.30 pm on Sunday.

Vasai tehsildar Avinash Koshti told PTI. Local fishermen, police and personnel from the ports department managed to rescue 11 persons, but one person was missing, he said. A helicopter was engaged for the search operation on Monday evening, and the body of Sanjay Mukne was found this morning, the official said. (PTI)
